Dear Residents and Landowners:

Under the supervision of the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (the "TCEQ"), the water delivered to a water system is tested periodically. Recent analysis from the testing of five water wells serving Sienna Plantation Municipal Utility District (the "District") shows that the naturally occurring fluoride concentration in two of the wells is in excess of the Environmental Protection Agency's (the "EPA") recommended level.

Although fluoride is a naturally occurring element present in many water sources, and additional fluoridation of community water is highly effective in reducing the occurrence of dental decay, the EPA and the TCEQ have set two levels (primary and secondary) of fluoride as the EPA standards. The higher standard (the primary level) is for the protection of public health, while the lower standard (the secondary level) is set due to the aesthetic effects that fluoride may have on the development of teeth in children. The optimal level of fluoride is determined by balancing of the beneficial effects of protection from tooth decay and the undesirable effects of excessive exposure leading to tooth discoloration.

The fluoride levels detected in the District's water supply are in excess of the EPA's lower standard (the secondary level) and therefore raise concerns about the aesthetic effects on the development of teeth in children. The level of fluoride in the District's water supply does not reach the EPA level that raises concerns about bone disease.

The District has authorized its consultants to investigate and pursue aggressive action for the most effective short-term and long-term solutions to lower the fluoride concentration in the District's water supply.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION ABOUT YOUR DRINKING WATER

Elevated Fluoride Levels Detected

This is an alert about your drinking water and a cosmetic dental problem that might affect children under nine years of age. At low levels, fluoride can help prevent cavities, but children drinking water containing more than 2 milligrams per liter (mg/l) of fluoride may develop cosmetic discoloration of their permanent teeth (dental fluorosis). The drinking water provided by your community water system Sienna Plantation Municipal Utility District No. 1 has a fluoride concentration of 2.9 mg/l.

Dental fluorosis in its moderate or severe forms may result in a brown staining and or pitting of the permanent teeth. This problem occurs only in developing teeth, before they erupt from the gums. Children under nine should be provided with alternative sources of drinking water or water that has been treated to remove the fluoride to avoid the possibility of staining and pitting of their permanent teeth. You may also want to contact your dentist about proper use by young children of fluoride-containing products. Older children and adults may safely drink the water.

Drinking water containing more than 4 mg/l of fluoride (the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency's drinking water standard) can increase your risk of developing bone disease. Your drinking water does not contain more than 4 mg/l of fluoride, but we are required to notify you when we discover that the fluoride levels in your drinking water exceed 2 mg/l because of this cosmetic dental problem.
